



DESIGN FEATURES:

- The library is located within the Dufferin Clark Community Centre
- The layout of the library was inspired by the shape of a snowflake, and has a bright and airy central atrium with four large solarium-style bays echoing the bright crystal points of a snowflake
- Interior renovations in 2001
- Public accessibility renovations in 2013 including new entrance doors
- Renovations in 2014 to lobby, circulation and information desk areas, and meeting room
- Accessibility features (AODA compliant)
