She has written *A Shark in the House*, *City Wolves*, *Rain and I*, *Crusty Crossed*, and *A Nice Fire and Some Moon pennies*. Born in Noranda, Quebec, Heffron was raised in various communities in Ontario, and attended public school and high school in Woodbridge. She has served on the National Council of The Writers' Union, the Board of Directors of PEN Canada, and the Toronto Arts Council. Heffron is the current Chair of the nominating committee for The Writers' Union of Canada. She holds a B.A. and M.A. in Literature and Philosophy from Queen's University.
