

by Taylor Jenkins Reid


The dramatic love life of fictional Old Hollywood icon Evelyn Hugo is the focus of this heart wrenching bestseller. Grab some tissues!

by Colleen Hoover


After getting out of prison, Kenna wants to get to know her estranged daughter. But everyone is determined to shut her out—except Ledger Ward.

by Jennette McCurdy


Another memoir makes the list with this chronicle of child star Jennette McCurdy's difficult childhood dealing with addiction, an abusive parent, and disordered eating.

by Barack Obama



by Matthew Perry



by Jordan Peterson




In this Hunger Games prequel, 18-year-old Coriolanus Snow is tasked with mentoring the tribute from District 12, a young woman named Lucy.

Mockingjay


by Suzanne Collins

The poignant, heart-wrenching account of Jewish teenager Anne Frank's experience hiding from the Nazis with her family during World War II.






