

by Shana Abé


This historical romance set among the New York elite follows Madeleine Talmage Force, part of the powerful Astor family, whose fate takes a turn on board the Titanic.


South African romance author Gaia is literally living her dreams in this magic-infused romance, while also confronting and healing from a traumatic childhood.

by John McFetridge



by Leah Johnson



by Kat Cho



by Anna-Marie McLemore



by Adiba Jaigirdar


Muslim teen Nishat struggles with her sexuality and acceptance from her family, with the help of friend/rival/love interest Flávia, and a school project based on henna.

by Robin Gow


Two trans boys are inspired by the story of two trans soldiers from the American Revolution in this contemplative romance about identity and first love.

#### **The Most Dazzling Girl in Berlin**








#### **A Perfect Father's Day**

#### **Hair Twins**


by Raakhee Mirchandani In this sweet picture book that champions diversity, a Sikh father and daughter share a special bond.

by Leah Henderson


This lyrical picture book with beautiful watercolour illustrations celebrates the loving relationships between fathers and their children.

by Seamus Kirst


Riley's classmate insists a family means a mother and a father. Will she have to choose between her two dads? An endearing and upbeat story about the meaning of family.


In this tender tale of father-daughter love, a little girl describes all the ways her father supports and takes care of her.
