
It's time to turn the TV off and embark on an exciting adventure. Packed with delightful artwork, the book follows Jake and his grandpa as they spend an unforgettable day together.

Grandma Ginny and Timmy take a trip to their old farm. Through engaging storytelling, the book illustrates the beauty of rural life and the value of family connections.





Basketball is a shared passion for childhood sweethearts Monica and Quincy, but the road to adulthood comes with pressures that challenge their relationship.




## **In the Heat of the Night**
