SIGN UP FOR YOUR LIBRARY CARD TODAY!

Family members can sign up for a library card at VPL's Family Literacy celebration. Customers with a VPL library card have access to over 500,000 items in the collections, several online databases and website resources. Children under 13 years of age can get their own kid's library card, which must be signed by their parent or guardian. If you live, work, own property, or are in attendance at an educational institution in the City of Vaughan, you qualify for free membership. If you live, work, own property, or are in attendance at an educational institution in a municipality with which Vaughan Public Libraries (VPL) has a reciprocal borrowing agreement, you may qualify for a free library card. The municipalities include: Aurora, Brampton, King Township, Markham, Newmarket, Richmond Hill and the Town of Caledon. In all cases, presentation of valid identification is required.
