Baby Fun and Play with your Baby

As you watch your baby play with their toys, join in and play with the toys the same way that they are playing with them.

Blow up a balloon and pass your baby to explore. Just keep an eye out, as if they squeeze it too tight, it'll burst, which can startle your little one.

> In a dark room, turn on a flashlight or a lamp and make shadows with your hands. Encourage your baby to do the same.

Make a hammock out of a blanket with you holding one end and someone else holding the other end. Place your baby in and sway them gently and close to the ground.

While sitting, put your baby on your knees and bounce them gently. As you're bouncing them, pretend you're a horse and say "Giddyap"! When your baby is playing with a toy, show them how to play with it in different ways (even if it's not the conventional way of playing with it).

Put some towels and pillows in a laundry basket or box. Then, sit your child in it, and push or pull the basket or box around your home.

> Play "airplane" with your baby by resting their tummy on your arm and swing them back and forth.

Blow up a balloon in front of your baby, but instead of tying it, let it deflate around the room. Watch your baby's reactions.

Hickory Dickory Dock

Hickory dickory dock. The mouse ran up the clock. The clock stuck one. The mouse ran down. Hickory dickory dock. Other verses: the clock struck two... the mouse said, "Boo!"; the clock struck three... the mouse said, "Whee!"; the clock struck four... the mouse said, "No more!"

Singing Tip!

For "Hickory Dickory Dock", clap your hands for when the clock strikes and clap them for the number you say (i.e. When clock strikes one, clap once. When clock strikes two, clap twice.)
