## Mirror Play with your Baby

While sitting in front of a mirror with your baby, tickle your baby's body. Name and point to each body part you are going to tickle.

> Spray water onto the mirror, then give your baby large pieces of cellophane to stick to the mirror.

Safety Tip! When using a mirror for these activities, ensure that they are firmly secure on the wall, or use non-breakable, plastic mirrors.

Sit your baby in front of a mirror and sit behind them. Bring out a toy or something of interest so they can see it in the mirror. See if they'll turn around to grab whatever you have. Find some stuffed animals and toys and perform a puppet show in front of a mirror. Encourage your baby to join in and watch themselves "perform" too.

Put your baby in front of a mirror with some toys and see if they watch themselves playing. If not, encourage them to look at the mirror by pointing to it.

Put out pictures of people with different facial expressions near a mirror. Point to the expressions and imitate them in a mirror. Encourage your baby to do the same. In front of a mirror, point to your baby's reflection and say their name, then point to them and say their name again. Then, do the same with yourself.

Put yourself and your baby in front of a mirror and tell them what you are both seeing (i.e. "I see your feet and my feet.")
